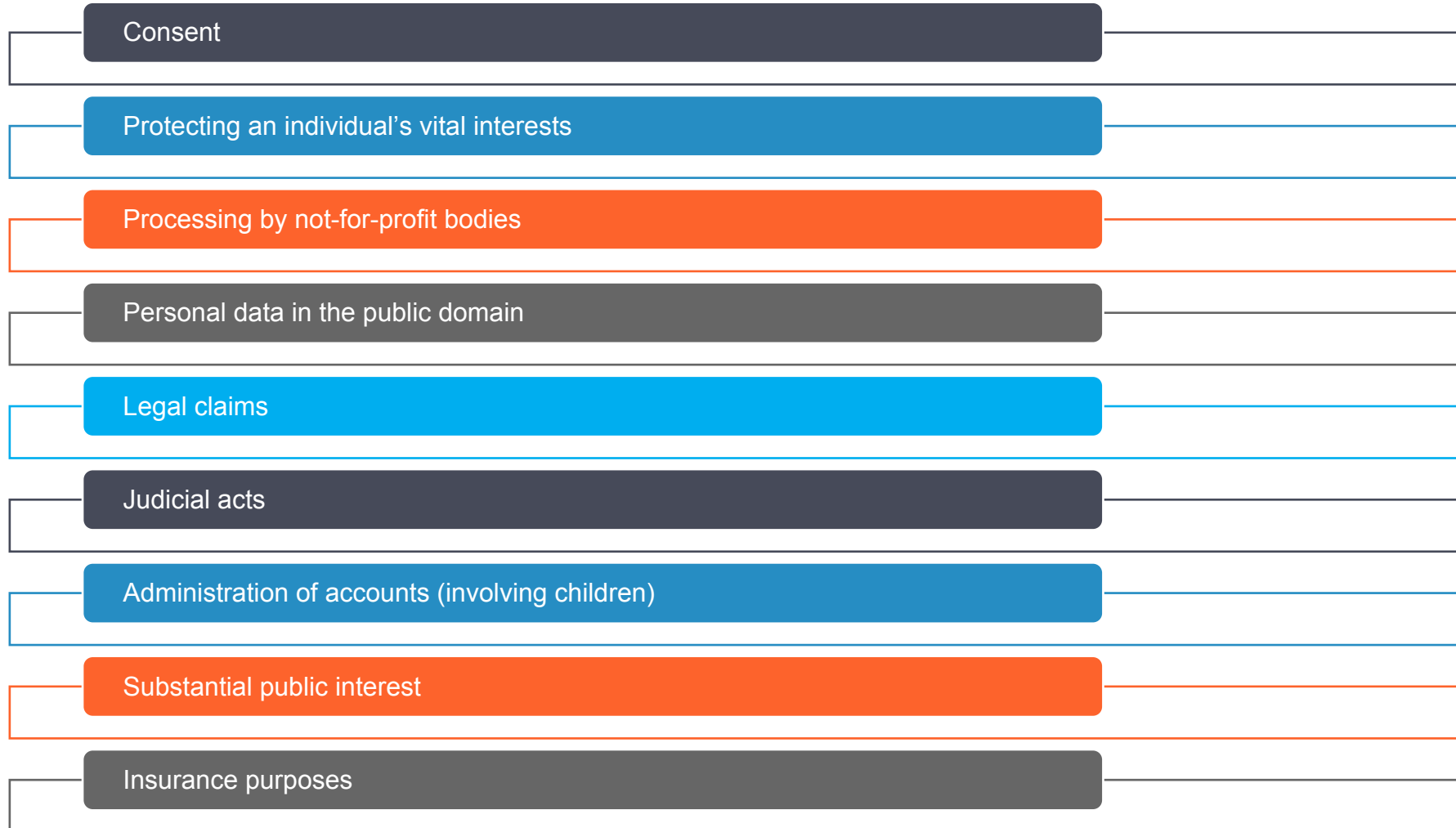

differs from the GDPR

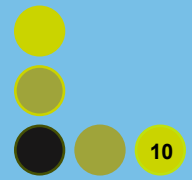
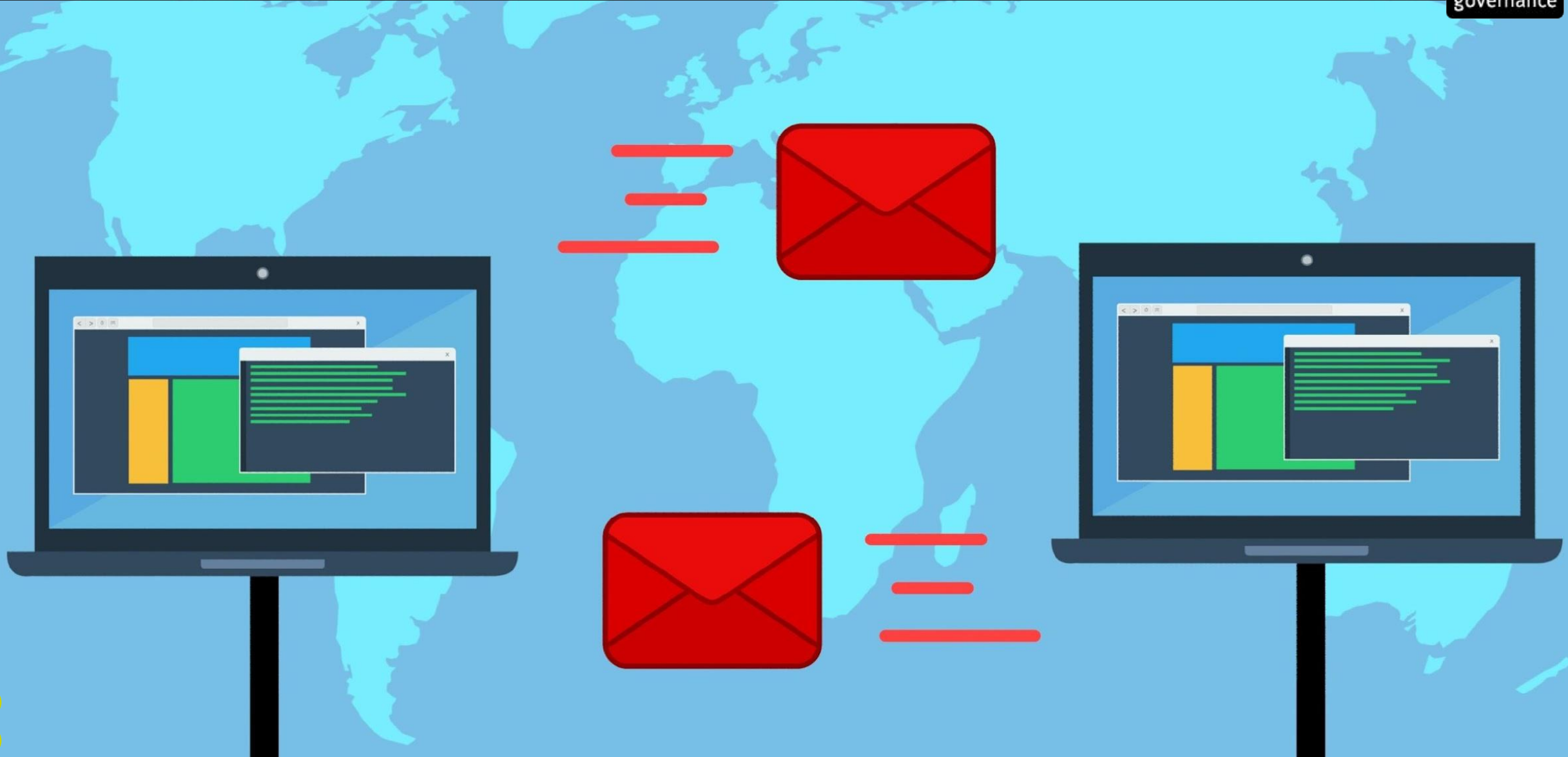

GDPR

Conditions that permit the processing of criminal convictions:



Transferring data to a third country



Information

To provide the ICO with information that it requires for carrying out its functions.

Assessment

To permit the ICO to assess whether the controller or processor has complied with data protection legislation.

Enforcement

To require a person to take the steps specified in the notice.

Penalty

The ICO requires a person to pay the amount specified in the notice.
